## From the Desk of the Secretary — Bill Chelonis

An interesting item comes up now and then that I receive from a member dealing with their wish to dimit (transfer) to another lodge for whatever reason. Grand Lodge (GL) Statutes state in Section 14.110 that the required dues will be paid before a dimit can be granted. In other words, a Member of our Lodge who is delinquent in their dues cannot receive a dimit to another Lodge without first paying their current dues (a minimum of six months dues if the dimit request is within that time period that a request is made.). The Secretary of the Lodge issuing a Transfer Dimit shall send the Dimit to the Lodge to which transfer was requested and notify the Member, requesting him to contact the local Secretary, giving them his name and address. Other items to note in this Section state a dimit cannot be granted to a member against whom charges, or misconduct, are pending (not that we have anyone in this position currently). If a member wishes to affiliate (join) our Lodge, they must pay the affiliation fee, which is fixed by each Lodge in its By-Laws. Ours is \$25 and must be current in their dues.





## **Dinners for Fire Victims**




### **CLIFFORD LOOBY SCHOLARSHIP**
