

For example, electricity keeps increasing, taxes are increasing, and food prices are increasing daily. The quantities are also getting smaller, so more units must be bought. The food suppliers are charging a delivery charge now. You know where this is going. The Lodge attendance hasn't increased to the point it was before Covid. The more meals we sell, the higher the profits will be. Then we can hold the prices down at our events. This is not happening. It is also one of the challenging issues the House Committee must deal with. I remember that if you were late to an event, finding a parking space in the parking lot was hard.

I am requesting the membership to give the House Committee your full support. They have some complicated decisions to make for our Lodge to continue to survive. For your input, you can attend the monthly House Committee meeting held at 4:30 pm on the second Thursday and Lodge Meetings held at 7:30 pm on the second and fourth Thursday of every month.

From the Desk of the Secretary – Bill Chelonis



Pursuant to G.L. Statues Section 12.050, the Secretary must read on the floor of the Lodge how we are doing twice a year. I will summarize this report for most of you who could not make the meeting.

We started the year with 558 members. We have initiated 24, affiliated by dimit 2, reinstated 7, stricken from the rolls for non-payment 27, granted transfer dimits 8, granted absolute dimits 2, and 9 members deceased during the year. This gives us a membership of 564, a gain for the year of 6 thus far.

The Lodge received for the 2022-2023 year: Dues of \$70,807.51, initiation fees of \$1725.00, and affiliation fees of \$50.00. We have 28 members who are delinquent in paying their dues. We paid a per capita assessment to California-Hawaii Elks Association of \$3,445.00, Grand Lodge \$13,800.22, and the Northeast District \$2,302.00. There are 5 candidates pending initiation, 0 pending transfer in, and 1 pending transfer out of the Lodge.





FROM THE HOUSE COMMITTEE

As the current events of the world have impacted all of us in our personal lives, so has our Lodge been affected.

It is the responsibility of the House Committee to make sure that any events held at the Lodge will make and continue to make money to cover all the expenses related to that event. This includes food costs, correct ticket pricing, employee labor, and overhead for things like utilities and janitorial services.

Our Lodge has had events for our members to enjoy for many years, but the Lodge cannot survive without membership support, and we need the membership to attend our planned events. Simply put, our outside events cover most of our expenses but not all of them. With that said, we have a busy December with outside events, but once the first of the year arrives, we are back to the membership supporting the Lodge.

The House Committee voted to increase all outside event prices 40% across the board, which includes food costs, labor costs, Lodge rental, and overhead expenses. We will also be increasing our bar prices by \$1.00 for all drinks.

Unless participation increases for our Tuesday night events, we will have no choice but to discontinue this particular event. This decision will be effective January 1st unless membership participation picks up.
