

Some interesting things in the Grand Lodge (GL) Statues one of which states: The Exalted Ruler, Esteemed Leading, Loyal, and Lecturing Knights, Secretary, and Treasurer shall constitute the Standing Relief Committee of the Lodge, which shall examine the merits of all cases suggesting the necessity of aid or relief.

During the opening of the meeting the Exalted Ruler asked the Esquire "Have you performed your duties?" The Esquire answers: "I have, Exalted Ruler, a quorum is present, the Officers are at their station in proper regalia,..etc... Did you know that according to GL Statues Article VII Section 3. Nine Members of the Subordinate Lodge, of whom at least two shall be elective Officers, shall constitute a "quorum", that visiting Elks cannot be counted in considering a "quorum". That the word "regalia" means emblems, symbols, or special dress, or in our case the jewels of office that the officers wear around their neck during the meeting.

Member must exhibit his membership card to the Tiler, or Inner Guard before being admitted to his own or any other Lodge. If he is unable to present his membership card to the Tiler of his own lodge the Secretary will verify if the member is current in their dues. If so, the Secretary will inform the Tiler to






