From the Desk of the Secretary - Bill Chelonis

GL Statutes 12.050 deals with the duties of the Secretary of the Lodge.

While there are many duties listed, there are also opinions and decisions listed. A couple of the opinions of interest that some wonder about are: #5 Both the Secretary and Exalted Ruler have the right to collect mail, but the Exalted Ruler cannot demand a key to the Secretary's office, the combination to the safe, or the password to the Secretary's computer, which contains all the membership records. #6 While the Secretary may collect all mail for the Lodge, any mail addressed by name to the Exalted Ruler or other person of the Lodge should be delivered to them unopened unless each has given the Secretary permission to open. Lodge mail not bearing a name can be opened by the Secretary as the Lodge's correspondent. #8 All Lodge records should be open for inspection by a member at all reasonable times. #14 If the office of the Lodge Secretary is vacant, necessary continuity in the signing of issuance of membership cards and other Secretarial duties should be exercised by an Acting Secretary appointed with full power and authority by the Exalted Ruler until an election can be held. (side note: I'm not leaving as Secretary).

Pursuant to GL Statutes Section 12.050, the Secretary must read on the floor of the Lodge how we are doing twice a year. Once in April and again in November. I will summarize this report during the Nov 13th meeting.

Also, GL Statutes 2.020 States that on the first Sunday in December, the Lodge will hold the "Elks Memorial Day." This year it's on Dec 7th at noon. Next month in the bulletin, I will be posting the names of those members who have passed away this year thus far.

It is also the phrase "a day that would live in infamy" referring to December 7, 1941.

It has been almost a year and a half since discussions and negotiations began for a broadband fiber hut to be placed at the far edge of our dirt parking lot. At the Lodge Meeting on 9/11, I announced that Grand Lodge had approved our Building Application.

Now, Tilson Tech, the firm working with the State, is finalizing the signature page of the lease that both parties have agreed to, so we can get it signed. Once that is done, we will be one step closer to receiving \$36,000 per year (plus a 2% annual escalation) for a minimum of 20 years, and possibly up to 30 years.

Tilson is still in the process of finishing the detailed building plans for the City of Auburn. So, there will still be a little more time before the groundbreaking and building can start..







#### WIL THOMAS EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

This is the seventh year for the Wil Thomas Educational Scholarship. This scholarship's value is \$1000.00 and is for family members of past or present members of the Auburn–Grass Valley Elks Lodge 538. It is offered to seniors who plan to attend a university, college, or vocational school in the Fall of 2026.
