Veterans Corner

Here we go again. Happy New Year 2021. I trust that your holidays, Christmas and New Year's, went well for you and your family. Another year fades into the books of history, but it won't soon be forgotten. I suspect the most popular Christmas gift (given to oneself) was "good health." If you were blessed with such a gift, nurture it and keep a close watch over it.

Taking a quick look back in our military history, here are a few of the events that took place in January. On January 9, 1945, the U.S. forces landed on Luzon, Philippine Islands. January 17, 1991, Operation Desert Storm began. January 28, 1973, the Vietnam Cease-Fire campaign ends. January 30, 1968, really stands out in my mind as that was when the Tet Offensive began in South Vietnam. I was under orders to report to a military police unit in Saigon. My next younger brother was already serving in Vietnam. My orders were rescinded, and by June 1 was sent to Seoul, South Korea as a criminal investigator. I had another younger brother serving stateside while my youngest brother was preparing to enter the U.S. Army (en route to a three-year tour in Germany). We followed in the footsteps of our father, who served in the U.S. Army for five years during WWII, with most of his time spent in the European Theatre.

Going forward with this year, we will get back to the activities that we enjoyed before 2020. There will be a Veteran's luncheon in November and our Veteran's pictures on display in the Lodge. In early Spring, we'll plan a trip to the V.A. hospital in Reno, NV, for a BBQ luncheon, IF the hospital is out from under the current COVID-19 restrictions. I'll keep you posted.





AUBURN ELKS LODGE 1691 SCHOLARSHIPS FOR 2020 - 2021

This year there are two scholarships for seniors graduating in the Spring of 2021. The scholarships will be available beginning October 22, 2020.

Because of Covid-19, seniors must send an email requesting an application to James Harris at invtoad@att.net. Applicants must indicate which scholarship application they are applying for. However, they can apply for both. Applicants will receive one or both applications by return email.

Wil Thomas Educational Scholarship

This is the second year for the Wil Thomas Educational Scholarship. This scholarship's value is \$1000.00 and is for family members of past or present members of the Auburn Elks Lodge 1691. It is offered to seniors who plan to attend a university, college, or vocational school in the Fall of 2021. Last year's winner graduated from a California high school.

Looby Scholarship

This is the fifteenth year the Looby Scholarship has been offered to graduating seniors planning to attend a university or college in the Fall of 2021. The value of this scholarship is \$1250.00. The senior must be a child, stepchild, or grandchild of an active Elk in Auburn Lodge 1691. Previous winners of this scholarship have graduated from high schools in California (last year), Nevada, Oregon, and Washington.

Questions regarding either scholarship should be directed to James Harris at invtoad@att.net. Again, applications will be available starting October 22, 2020, and must be returned (postmarked) by February 28, 2021.

Winners will be notified during March 2021.
