From the Station of the Leading Knight

One of the many responsibilities of the Leading Knight is to be the chairman of the House Committee. It is the responsibility of the House Committee to make sure the club/kitchen and bar are making money to cover its costs. When I was a trustee of this Lodge, I kept saying that the labor costs were not correct and that the monthly expense reports were not showing the true cost of the employees. For many years nothing has been done about this. Well, now that this falls under my leadership, I am required to bring these expenses in line. Therefore, come November of this year, the costs for an Elks function/event will be increased to \$385, and for non-Elk events, the cost will be increased to \$500. The increases are to try and bring in line the current costs. We are not going to be changing, at this time, current prices of Lodge Meeting dinners, Birthday Dinners, Taco Tuesday, and "All you can eat Breakfast/Pizza night although many outside the House Committee have argued that you can't eat anywhere at our current prices. Yes, we did increase bar prices to bring them in line with current expenses, and most of you have accepted this fact. Thank you.

Another area the House is looking into is the "Auburn Elks Catering" brochure/catalog prices. Many of these do not reflect the current costs and expenses to cover an event. With food costs going up, some of these catering prices will need to be realigned to make sure we are not losing money in the club. I know these changes are not pleasant to hear, but our Lodge needs to cover its expenses. If we don't do this, we will not be able to pay our bills, and that is something I cannot allow as chairman of the House Committee. These are hard decisions, and I wish there were some other way. Please keep in mind that as Elks, we still enjoy many of these events at a much lower cost than at a restaurant or bar.

On another note, the tickets for the Fashion show "Shine the Light on Fall Fashion" honoring Pam Moore is going well. The event is scheduled for Oct 19th.
