


#### VOLUNTEER NEEDS AT THE LODGE

# From the Secretary Bob Oles

The Lodge year is half over and we started April 1, 2018 – 2019 lodge year with 707 members. As of September 20,

2018, we have initiated 30 new members, affiliated 1, and reinstated 2 members. We have dropped from the rolls 9, transferred out 5, and lost 2 to death. This gives us a membership of 724, a gain for the year of 17. We still have 37 members who have not paid their dues for the 2018 – 2019 lodge year causing a lapsation rate of 5.23%. We have 4 new applications for membership into the Order that are being processed.

If you have a change of address or need to order a name badge, we have order forms in the office or at the bar. Please remember to print legibly so that the correct information gets to the Secretary and if you lose your key card or badge there is a \$10 charge to replace it.







## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

#### **Bill Costa**

How did Halloween reach America? It was only in the second half of the

nineteenth century when America was flooded with Irish immigrants because of the Great Famine from 1845 to 1852 in Ireland that the popularity of Halloween spread and grew. Halloween had lost most of its spiritual and religious meaning by the early 20th Century because of the move in America to make the festival less scary and more about community spirit. In America, Halloween is now the second largest commercial celebration after Christmas, and Americans spend \$6 billion on Halloween each year.

Where does Trick or Treating come from? Trick or Treating started on this side of the pond in Ireland, Scotland and Wales and involved people dressing up and going door to door asking for food. People would say poems or sing songs in exchange for food, this tradition evolved into children saying prayed in return for 'soul cakes' in the 11th century. The soul cakes were sweet with a cross tops, similar to hot cross buns, and were intended to represent a spirit being freed from purgatory when eaten. By the 19th century, this had evolved into a tradition where children would sing songs, tells jokes and read poems instead of prayers for pieces of fruit and money. Later, the children would play threatening pranks on people to get them to hand over sweets.
