The Fourth of July—also known as Independence Day or July 4th—has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

John Adams believed that July 2nd was the correct date on which to celebrate the birth of American independence, and would reportedly turn down invitations to appear at July 4th events in protest. Adams and Thomas Jefferson both died on July 4, 1826—the 50th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence.

Remember the Alamo!

On the first of July my wife, Linda, and I will be in San Antonio Texas representing our Lodge at the Elks National Convention that will be held there the 1st through the 4th of July. If we can survive the heat and humidity of Texas in July I will report back on the Grand Lodge activities and transactions in this article next month.

Last month I talked to you about the success of our ritual team at the Northeast District competition that earned us the privilege to represent the Northeast District at the State Competition. Unfortunately, when you are competing against the Top Lodges from sixteen districts across the state the competition is better and the judges stricter in their scoring. I believe we placed 11th of the 16 teams that competed but I prefer to think that we placed 11th of the 168 total Lodges that were represented at the California and Hawaii Elks convention. I'm also very grateful for the way that our team came together and performed and know that we will now be able to initiate new candidates in our Lodge throughout the year.

In other news from the State Convention. I was very proud to walk across the stage on the last day of the convention and present the total donations that the members of our Lodge contributed throughout the past year for the Major Project (or Purple Pig). In total, we raised just over \$17,000 for this cause. With the Elks National Foundation contributing back to the State over one million dollars the total raised last year to help the children walk, talk, see and play exceeded 3.5 million dollars. Thank you all for your generous donations to this cause. I will take a minute here to talk to you about membership cards and door keys. This time of year, we have asked

I will take a minute here to talk to you about membership cards and door keys. This time of year, we have asked the greeters at our door to be especially careful in checking membership cards at the door. Why do we do this? Two reasons:

1. We have a liquor license for a private club which means we can only sell to our members and their guests (this is also the reason why we ask you to make sure that you have signed your guests into our guest log each time you bring someone to the Lodge). We must make sure that those that enter our Lodge are members or registered guests in order not to run afoul of the law.


2. With annual membership fees due at the end of March we still have quite a few members that have not paid for the 2018-2019 year. In most cases, we find this is because the billing statement was lost, overlooked, or forgotten; but in fairness to those that have paid on time we are checking to see if your card is up to date.

For members that we have no record of dues being paid, we have turned off the electronic key card. The greeter will usually wait to see if you are able to open the door with your key card and if not will ask to see your membership card to see that it is current for this year. Please do not feel insulted if this happens. With close to 700 members we cannot expect our greeters to recognize each of our members.

Remember also that when you were initiated the instructions you were given stated: "The membership card, which will be presented to you by the Secretary, is a means of identification. It shows you are a member in good standing in this Lodge. You should carry it with you at all times. You are required to present it to gain admission to this Lodge, and without it you cannot gain admission to another Lodge".

Thank you for helping us to meet this requirement.


