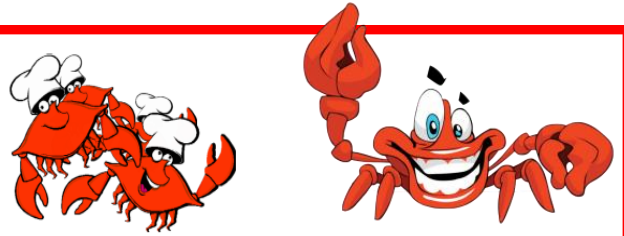

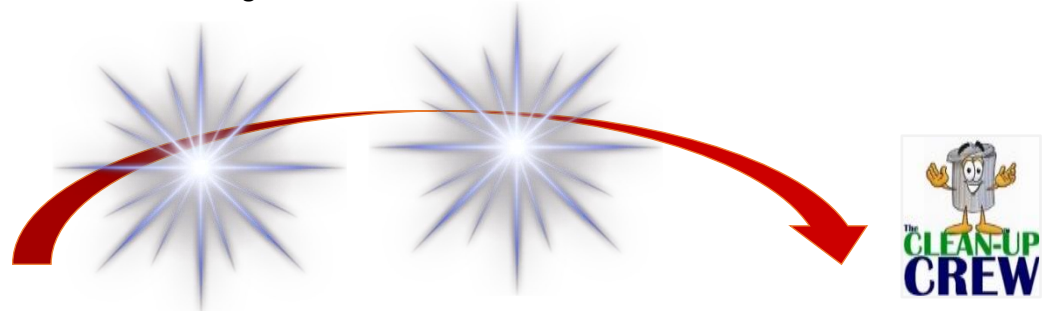
Hello Fellow Elks,

Lodge Cleanup Reminder

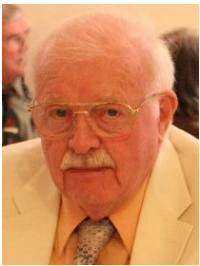
Please remember Lodge Cleanup the 1st Wednesday each month at 9:00 am. The next one is on January 3rd.

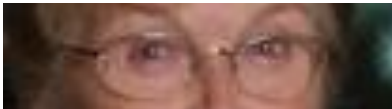

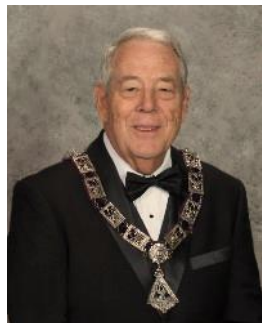

Bob's Message – Lodge Manager

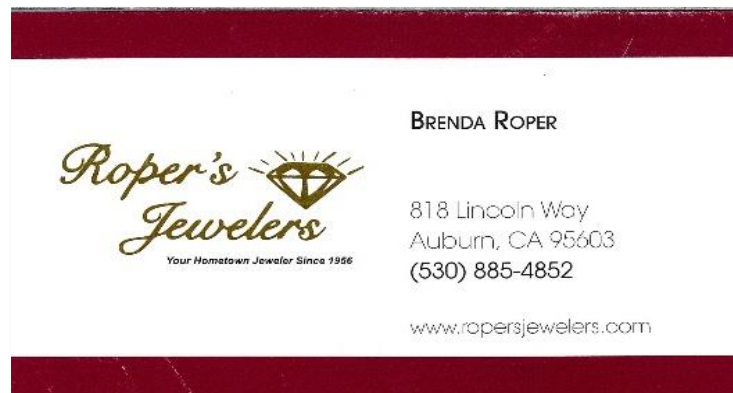

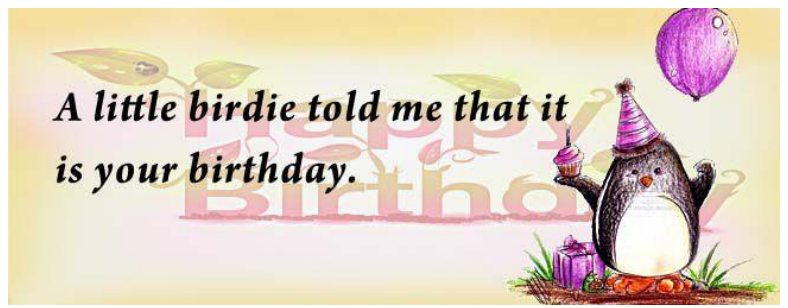
