Lodge Improvements:



From the Secretary Bob Oles

The Lodge year is half over. We started April 1, 2017 – 2018 year with 754 members, 58 down from last year. As of September 30, 2017, we have initiated 30, affiliated 6, reinstated 2, for a subtotal of 38 new members. We have dropped from the rolls 24, transferred out 6, granted 1 absolute dimit, and lost 12 to death for a subtotal of 42. This gives us a membership of 749, a loss for the year of 5. We still have 40 members who have not paid their dues for 2017 – 2018 lodge year causing a lapsation rate of 5.44%. We have 4 new applications for membership into the Order that are being processed. We all have a lot of work to do to bring our membership back up to cover for the loss of members which was a result of deaths, transfers out, and those members who chose not to continue to be Elks.

The Lodge received for 2017 – 2018 lodge year as of September 30, 2017 lodge year: Dues \$107,680.75, initiation fees \$2,475.00, and affiliation fees \$190. The following donations were received: Major Project \$2,684.00, Elks National Foundation \$2,562.00 and lodge maintenance fund \$3,454.00. The Lodge bulletin received for ads \$1,113.35. The general fund received from outside events, donations, \$8,710.00.

Auburn Elks Lodge #1691, per-capita assessments for lodge year 2017 – 2018 were paid to: The B.P.O. Elks Grand Lodge, \$12,064.00; California-Hawaii Elks Association, \$4,901.00 and Northeast District Elks \$2,255.00 for a total per-capita assessment of \$19,220.00.

Half year report on the Lodge's Volunteer, Youth, Charitable and Community Service Programs. Head count of participants 166, Elks 29, Helpers 28, Elks hours 327, Helper hours 170, Elks miles 755, Helper miles 500, Non- cash (est. value) \$1,570.00 and cash \$1,050.00.

Our Lodge needs to make the Elks National Foundation Grand Exalted Ruler's goal of \$4.75 per member to qualify for the Elks National Foundation Grants from \$2,000 up to \$10,000. Our Lodge can use the Grants to help youth programs and community projects.

If you have a change of address or need to order a name badge, we have order forms in the office or at the bar. Please remember to print legibly so that the correct information gets to the Secretary and if you lose your key card there is a \$10 charge to replace it.




