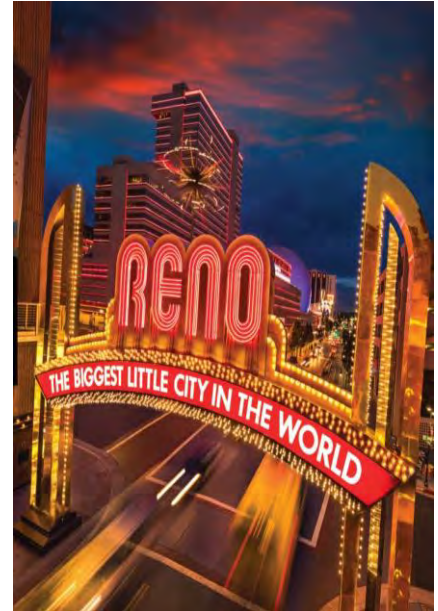


We are half way through the calendar year already. Amazing! Supposedly time goes by faster as we get older, but I prefer to think of time going by quickly because we are so busy.

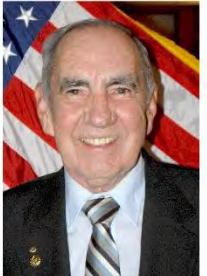

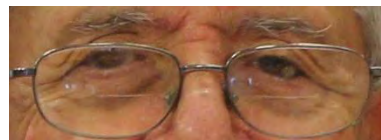

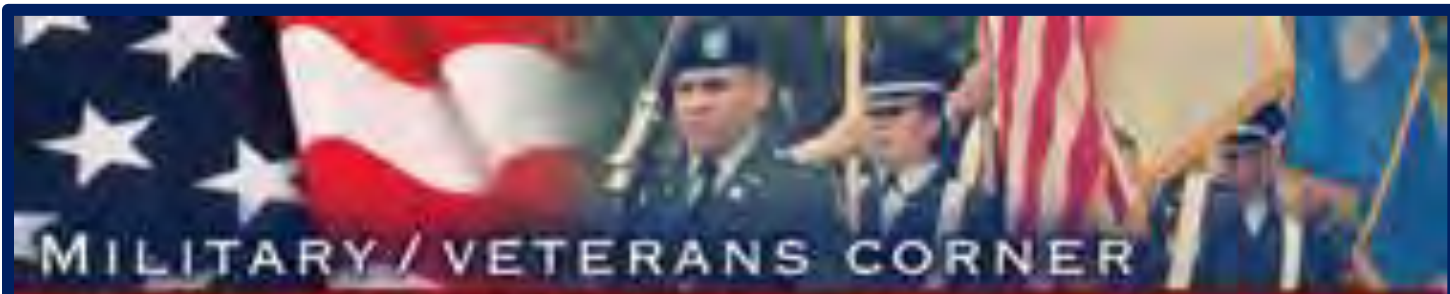

The Army, Air Force, and Navy exchanges will start allowing all honorably discharged Veterans to shop online. The target start date is Veterans Day, November 11, 2017, but you must register first. Registration began June 1, 2017. You must call 1-844-868-8672 now to register. You can purchase anything except uniforms, alcohol, and tobacco products. Remember, you do not pay taxes on your purchases. Read about this at:
