Happy Thanksgiving everyone. I trust that those of you who have family locally will be celebrating this festive holiday with them. To the rest of you, may you enjoy the holiday in spirit with your friends or family.

As we enter this month do not forget that the Veterans luncheon is on Saturday, November 5. Cocktails are from 11am until lunch is served about noon. Remember, Veterans get to have a free hot lunch while those who are non-Vets you get to pay a stipend of \$10 each. Such a deal. Regarding the menu, we'll be serving pork loin and chicken. Along with those two entrees there will be a salad bar, mashed potatoes and gravy as well as a seasonal vegetable. Applesauce, rolls and a dessert will also be provided. Where in our part of the world can you get a meal like this for free? Spread the word to all your Veteran friends. Give them a lift to the Lodge if they need assistance. We will have our second annual display of pictures of Lodge Veterans posted along the Lodge meeting room wall. If you're a Veteran and have not provided us with an 8"x10" picture of you in your military uniform, please do so. Along with the picture please give us a brief history of your military service. It may be late for this year, but it will certainly be posted next year. Thank you for your service and participation in this event.

I am hoping that by the time you are reading this, the decorated granite bench will be installed at the Veterans memorial in the Auburn cemetery. 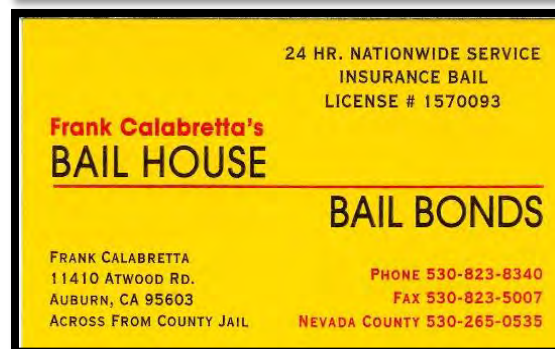
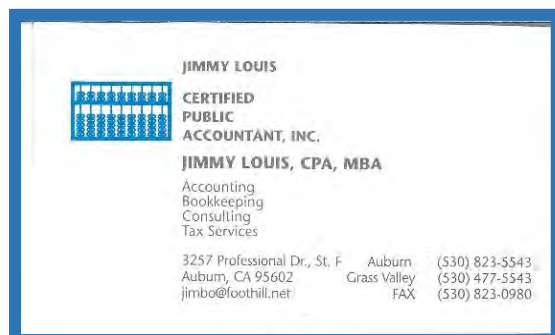
Dick Robart PER underwent a 10-hour back surgery on October 17th. Libby said, "he'll be home October 22nd if all goes well".

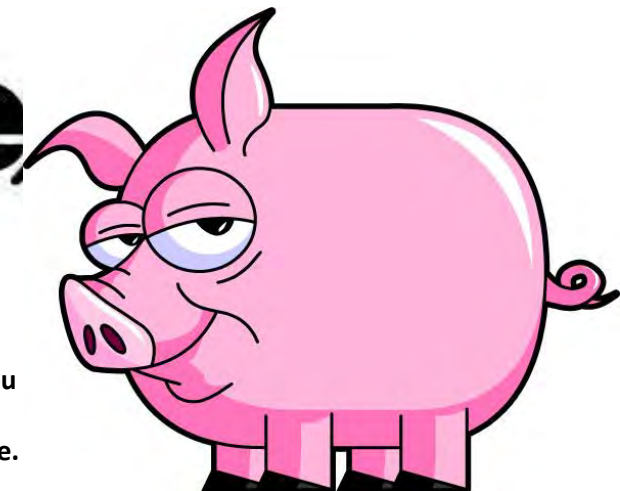
