From the Secretary

Our Lodge, at the first regular meeting in September, will be voting on the Amendment Ratifications to the Constitution which were adopted at the 152nd Grand Lodge Session in Houston, Texas on July 5, 2016. The Resolutions are posted on the Lodge bulletin board:

- 1. 2016-02- To eliminate any responsibility for the Elks National Home given its recent sale.
- 2. 2016-05- To clarify that Lodge trusts and other related legal entities are subject to the applicable provisions of section 16.030 of the laws of the Order.
- 3. 2016-07- To Provide that Local Lodges with memberships of 99 or less only require seven (7) Members to constitute a guorum.
- 4. To clarify that the elected Trustees of a Lodge shall be not less than three (3) nor more than five (5).

Our Auburn Elks Lodge #1691 By-laws revision has been approved by the Grand Lodge Judiciary Committee. Our By-laws may now be accessed online by any member of our lodge through elks.org Virtual Home page:

Lance was born and raised in Jamestown, New York. He graduated from high school and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He was assigned to the North Island Naval Air Station in Coronado, California, where he served as a plane captain and jet engine mechanic. At the height of the Vietnam conflict he was promoted and assigned to the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Ticonderoga in San Diego. He served as an Aircraft Support Officer and Master at Arms Officer. The ship was assigned a duty in Vietnam in 1967 and returned to San Diego in 1968. Lance was honorably discharged from the Navy in 1969.

Lance married his high school sweetheart Karen. They raised 4 children, two boys and two girls, and have 10 grandchildren, 5 boys and 5 girls. In between raising a family, work, and attending college he coached Junior All American Football, Little League Baseball, and Girls' Soccer.



Lance obtained an AA Degree from Glendale Community College and a B.A. degree in Personnel Management from the University of Redlands. He holds a life time Teaching Credential issued by the State of California, teaching traffic safety of the Los Angeles School District and Motorcycle Safety for the Conejo Valley School District.

Lance graduated from the Highway Patrol Academy in July 1970. After graduating from the CHP academy he was assigned to the Glendale area. He worked street patrol for 8 years, including 4 years of riding motorcycles. In 1976 he was awarded Officer of the Year by the Optimist Club of Burbank. Lance was promoted to Sergeant in 1978 and was transferred to the East Los Angeles Area CHP Office where he served as a Field Supervisor. He was selected to supervise the CHP's Southern Division Public Affairs unit from 1980 – 1983. In 1983 he was assigned to the CHP Olympic Games Planning Committee. He served as the Intelligence Liaison Supervisor with the CHP/FBI Olympics Intelligence task force. After the Olympics, many of his supervisory positions included, Vehicle Theft and Environmental Crimes Investigations and Commercial Vehicle and K-9 Narcotics Enforcement.



Lance transferred to the San Luis Obispo CHP Division Headquarters in 1994 and was assigned to the Investigations Unit. He retired in 2002 after serving the State of California for 32 years.

In 1995 Lance was initiated into the Santa Maria Lodge #1538. He served on the Rodeo Committee in 1995 and 1996 and is presently an associated member of Santa Maria Lodge. In 2003 he transferred to the Atascadero Lodge #2733. He has served on numerous committees including the House Committee (7 years) and the Board of Trustees (4 years) and Building Committee (2 years). He was chosen as Lodge Officer of the Year in 2009-2010 and remains active in the Lodge. He advanced through the chairs and became the Exalted Ruler in 2007- 2008. Lance was elected Secretary of the Lodge in 2008 and served three years. He served as the first Chicago Lodge Management Coordinator for the District and was appointed as Association Vice President in 2009-2010. Lance has served as an Officer on the District Past Exalted Rulers Association for 4 years. Lance was selected to District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 2011-2012. He served as the State Membership Chairman for two years and was elected to the California-Hawaii Elks Association as First Vice President in 2015.



- * Every Tuesday evening at 6:30 pm we will have a drawing for a chance to win 50% of the pot as grand prize of the Queen of Hearts.
- * Tickets are \$1.00 each. Only Elk Members and spouses in good standing may purchase tickets. As many tickets as wanted, may be purchased. Print your name & phone number, on the back of the stub to be deposited. Drop it in the ticket box on the wall next to the card display box.
- * If you do not put your name & phone number on the ticket and it is drawn, it will be destroyed and a new ticket will be drawn.
- * If the person whose ticket is drawn is present, he/she will pick a numbered envelope hoping that it contains the Queen of Hearts. The envelope will be removed from the board and the card in it will be removed and displayed for all to see. That person will be advised of their prize and awarded in cash unless they have drawn the Queen of Hearts, in which case they will be paid by check usually within 5 business days.




