#### **Veterans Corner**

**Thank you, thank you.** My heartfelt appreciation goes out to all those who accompanied me on our annual trip to the Reno Veterans Hospital for their BBQ luncheon. We had a total of 30 people from our Lodge who prepared and served a great BBQ lunch of hamburgers and polish sausages (a patient favorite) along with all the trimmings. Before lunch we were handing out candy to those who could have chocolate. Everyone went away with a tummy full of good food; a meal that they are not provided at the hospital due to the dietary concerns they have. The hospital allows for exceptions with our meals, so we gladly accommodate our Veterans there. Our group engaged in conversations with the patients, not only in the dining area, but also in their rooms, as some have difficulties moving about. We served lunch to about 60 patients in the center, and about 14 hospitalized in the hospice care unit. After all the housed patients were fed, we went about providing lunch to the staff who were available. When time allowed all the volunteers enjoyed their meal. As always the appreciation of our efforts was expressed. We put a smile on a lot of faces last Monday, June 6, 2016. All are looking forward to our return next year. As I spoke with many of the patients there I told each one that I was looking forward to seeing them again next year about this time, knowing full well that many won't be with us that long. We all did our best to make them comfortable with our food and cheer. The leftover food, as usual, is taken across the street to the resident guest house where family members stay when visiting their Veteran living in the hospital. The manager there was very appreciative of our donations as it always saves the families some money with their food costs. We make a lot of people happy when we make this trip to Reno. The exception with the extra food is the soda pop. I always buy extra and it stays with the unit at my request. Reason being is that there are a couple of soda pop machines available to the patients, but they come with a cost. The unit supervisor always thanks us for leaving the soda as there was about enough for each patient in the unit to have a couple cans. Money is something that many of the patients do not have much of.

We had some new volunteers this year. I had one couple tell me that they will return with us every year from now on. I appreciate that. Along with the lunch we brought to the hospital many boxes of books, toiletries, socks, and other personal affects that the patients would enjoy. One of our members made about two dozen lap afghans. When we turned all our donations into the appropriate office, the manager there looked at everything with a big smile and then referred to a nationally recognized chart that reflected our donations having a value of close to \$2,000. Way to go Elks Lodge 1691.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED AND SELECTED SEATING COMES FIRST.


