

Auburn Lodge No. 1691 is 75 years old, granted a Charter on July 11, 1946, as a subordinate Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of The United States of America. Our Lodge is proud of our affiliation with and support of our national organization that itself was organized 153 years ago in February. Our 75th Anniversary celebration will continue for the remaining 7 months of this Lodge year, with bulletin articles looking back on our rich history as well as including our goals and path to the future.

More good news! For the first time in more than a year, we are on a path to reopening regular events, regular Lodge meetings, the first traditional initiation of 14 new members, fraternal and social opportunities, and other members and their guests. In addition, some of our core catered events have returned. A sincere welcome back to the Rotary Club of Auburn, SIRS No 37 & 79, better yet a great deal of contact regarding booking future calendar catered events. Back to the basics of returning to the Lodge for the fraternal, social, club, and dining opportunities moving forward.

This is not a trick question. It is based on our obligation and State Law. Recall our initiation as Elks in an exchange between the Exalted Ruler and the Esquire? The ER asks, how do you prove yourself an Elk? By displaying my membership card when asked to do so. When the ceremony is complete the secretary will present you with a membership card. Carry it with you at all times to gain admission to this Lodge (your Lodge) or any other Lodge you may visit. The second, and equally if not more important, reason is our compliance with California law regarding our privilege to be granted a Club license for the on-premises sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages for members and guests only. Viewed absolutely, there is no wiggle room in the basic requirement to present your card when asked, period! We currently have over 600 members on our roll. Just over 86% are current this Lodge year. Checking for member cards, especially at the beginning of the Lodge year, is just a tool to remind our members and us that you must be current with dues for admittance. Just remember it is not personal. It is simply business, adhering to the statutes of our order and the laws of our state. Occasionally I may be the officer at the door. If I am, and you are offended I asked to see your card, I will offer to display mine first. You must match it for admittance. My assurance that anyone assigned the duty to ask for

Finally, our rules for entry are Low Tech, no TSA, facial recognition, thumbprints, emptying your pockets or purse, or disrobing, simple please help, and be kind to the fellow ELK asking.

A continuing issue that will be a priority to correct and improve upon is the change of address, phone, and emergency contact information. Most important is emergency information for our singles. Please call, email, or send a note to me regarding your emergency contact information; children, siblings, extended family, neighbor. It will help us help you when necessary.

Speaking of our 75th Anniversary, we have beautiful 75th Anniversary Coins available for just \$10.00. I will have some with me every time I'm at the Lodge. Some will be available at the bar as well. In addition, coin sales will assist with celebration expenses.

Veterans Corner

Here we are in the middle of our summer. August is the time one should be taking a vacation from your daily life. The Lodge is now fully open, with few restrictions. Our problem is that we are not fully back to all our events like it was before the pandemic. We are in the middle of retooling all the regularly scheduled events. Our military history was very active in August over the years. August 4 is the birthday of the U.S. Coast Guard. On August 6, the atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima. August 7, 1782, the Badge of military merit (Purple Heart) was established. On August 9, 1945, an atomic bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, Japan, and on August 15, 1945, Japan accepts unconditional surrender terms. On August 21, 1865, the Civil War was officially declared over, and on August 16, 1972, the last Army combat ground forces depart Vietnam. These are just a sample of the military events that occurred in the month of August.


